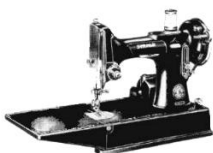

Finishing packages can be purchased later. Marti Michell A and C Templates recommended but not a must as traceable shapes are included in block instructions. Templates and Log Cabin Rulers available for purchase. Months 1 - 4 of both Bright and Neutral Colorways are available to order.
