It's Just a Quilt.... Why should I have it appraised?

Many people wonder why they should have their antique and modern quilts appraised. "It's just a quilt that I made for my bed" or, "It's just that old thing from Great-aunt Hattie. What could it possibly be worth?"

Unfortunately, many times, the quilt owner finds out too late that their quilts had more value than a blanket purchased from a local store when the quilts are damaged, destroyed, or stolen.

Just imagine this: You are shipping a quilt to a quilt show in another area or are sending a newly completed quilt to your grandbaby. The quilt is on the seat of your car in a box. You stop for just a moment at the store, return and find that your car has been broken into and the box with your quilt is gone. Or you return home to find that your house has been burglarized and the thieves have used the quilt from your bed to carry off the silver!

Everyone knows how quickly weather can change. In an instant, a tornado or a flood can rip through your home, leaving the contents destroyed, and your family heirloom quilts ruined before your eyes.

When you call the insurance agent to report the theft or damage, he will ask what the items were and what their worth was. He or she will also ask, "Can you prove it?"

You must have a written appraisal by a qualified appraiser in the area of quilts and quilted textiles, or the replacement value of your precious items will be the same as bedding or blankets from the local chain store!

Why do you need to have a quilt appraised?

- ❖ To establish a replacement value for insurance purposes
- To provide protection when the quilt is shipped to quilt shows or individuals
- To provide value to a quilt show that requires insurance or an appraisal for their insurance coverage
- ❖ To determine the value for a donation, gift or estate purposes for the IRS
- To purchase a "fine arts floater" insurance endorsement to your Homeowner's Policy
- ❖ A thoughtful addition to a quilt given as a gift
- To inform your family that Grandmother's quilt is indeed a family heirloom and a thing of value

Is there more than one type of appraisal?

Yes, there are three basic types of appraisals:

Insurance Replacement Value: is the determination of what the replacement value of your quilt is, in other words, what would it take to replace your quilt with another "of like and kind"? The insurance replacement appraisal you receive will be a short form briefly describing the quilt and will serve to place a value in the insurance adjuster's mind for the lost or damaged quilt. With this type of appraisal, the quilt can be covered under a Fine Arts Floater on your homeowner policy. Always check with your insurer about this floater.

Fair Market Appraisals: are for the market value of a quilt, which is the amount agreed on between a will and knowledgeable buyer and willing and knowledgeable seller under normal conditions. Fair market appraisal is an opinion of the appraiser based on what she knows to the value of a quilt to be. She may obtain her values from a number of sources including but not limited to new and antique items, galleries, auctions and private sales. This is not a guarantee of a sales price. If you are considering selling a quilt, than this is the type of appraisal you want.

Tax Donation Appraisal: this type of appraisal is used to meet the requirements of the IRS as to the value of a quilt that is being donated for any reason, or to establish a value for a family estate, very often after a death.

For whatever reason you are seeking an appraisal, it is important to know that quilts can become the targets of theft or casualties of natural disasters. Many quilts and garments that are quilted have disappeared en route to quilt shows in other parts of the country. Many carriers, including UPS, now require a written appraisal for justify coverage while your item is in their care, and many shows are now required to have appraisals for the items they display in order to meet the insurance requirements of the venue.

Your quilts are valuable pieces of your family's history and should be protected by a written appraisal in case of loss, theft or damage.
