She lives in Hudson, Florida and was 19 years of age at that time. Her project was to give a quilt to every family of a fallen soldier in Iraq. I sent a quilt top to her as she requested patriotic tops or even just red, white, and blue fabric. Even though I do not know where my quilt now lives it gives me great satisfaction to know maybe someone is helped by receiving it in memory of their loved one's greatest sacrifice. The latest update from Jessica's family that I just received is this: to date she has quilted and sent over 1,700 quilts to 1,350 families of our fallen. They have been including quilts for any dependent children. What an undertaking – all of this while attending college and taking a full load of courses!
