# **Article III, Section 7 – Guest**

#### Current:

Any person may attend one (1) meeting during a calendar year; however, further attendance requires payment of membership dues.

Any person may attend one (1) meeting during a calendar year with the exception of however, further attendance requires payment of membership dues.

## Article IV, E, 10:

#### Current:

for all incoming funds, a two part written carbon receipt shall be prepared. The original copy shall be given to the payee and the carbon copy maintained by the AHQG;

## Proposed Change:

The original copy shall be given to the payee, **one copy to the treasurer and one copy to the committee chair who is collecting the money**. 
