Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild Board Meeting Minutes May 4, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 6 pm by President Joyce Boyd. Those in attendance: Joyce Boyd, Dea Heller, Susan Feeley, Pam Grunwald, Pat Forney, Janet Rutherford, Karon O'Ferrall, and Karen Lambdin.

Janet Rutherford made a motion to approve the April Board meeting minutes and Joyce Boyd seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.

Officer Reports:

2nd Vice President Dea Heller informed the board that the retreat went well and it had an income and outgo of \$10,025. The retreat is totally self-funded. Next years' contract is signed already.

The May speaker is Nova Lynn Montgomery who will talk about the 1933 Chicago's World Fair. The June program is charity pillows, July is Connie Silber with a workshop called "Finish it Off" just in time for the September quilt show that the San Antonio Quilt Guild is holding. In August, Jane Hardy Miller will talk about French braid quilts, and in September, Cynthia England will talk about and hold a workshop on her landscape quilts.

Treasurer Pat Forney got the online bank statements set up. No deposits were made this month due to family emergencies.

Pat requested an Office Word program and Dea offered to set it up for her.

The May balance is \$29,156.

Parliamentarian, Karon O'Ferrall said that the bylaw revisions will be in the next newsletter. There will also be an announcement about the new slate of officers needed.

Library, Susan Feeley got some new books at 40% off. She asked if she should renew the domain for the website, and was okayed for that action.

Charity, Pam Grunwald has used up all the money for charity and needs \$199 to finish 25 other quilts. Pam moved that \$199 be made available for charity and Dea Heller seconded the motion. All approved the motion.

At the June meeting, the guild will be filling 200 pillows that will be taken to the American Cancer Society for women with breast cancer. There will be a quilt-in on Saturday, June13th to make 6 hour quilts.

Old Business:

New Business:

Quilt Show, It was decided that the board is in favor of having a quilt show next year. Everyone was asked to look for a suitable venue for the show so that we can control the entrance and charge for admission. It will be a one-day event. No vendors at this show, but the guild will be open to the idea in the future.

Miniature Quilt Auction, Karen Lambdin suggested having one at the show. Members would donate mini quilts and a silent auction will be held.

Auction, the annual auction is set for October this year.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 pm

Section 8

A member will not use or give away the membership roster nor use the roster for personal gain or political reasons.

Section 1. Elected Officers.

Officers shall be members of AHQG. Officers shall have been members of AHQG for six (6) months prior to nomination. President must have served at least one year or currently be serving on the AHQG Board prior to nomination.
