April Board Meeting Minutes

The monthly board meeting of the Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild was called to order by President Dea Heller at 6pm on Monday, April 4th, 2011. Present were 1st Vice-President Vickie DuBose, 2nd Vice-President Joyce Boyd, Secretary/Librarian Susan Feeley, Treasurer Karon O'Ferrall, Charity Chair Joanne Krebbs, Newsletter Editor Ruth Willey, Publicity Chair Michele Hanus, Refreshments Chair Carole Van Buren, and Fundraising Chair Beverly Ramos. Absent were 2nd Vice-President Jackie Ledford, Membership Chair Janet Rutherford, and Parliamentarian Kathryn Slater.

Vickie had no report to give this evening. Joyce let us know that, to date, only 4 people have signed up for the Susan Cranshaw workshop in May. It was decided to have Ruth send out a flash to the membership to remind them of this upcoming workshop by a quilter who presented a program to us last year on her landscape/nature quilts. A decision will be made as soon as possible after next week's general meeting whether or not we will need to cancel, as Ms. Cranshaw requires a 30-day notification of cancellation. As of today 36 people are signed up for the guild retreat at the end of the month. A totebag for the retreat attendees was shown to the board.

Karon passed out copies of this month's budget report. She updated us, letting us know that all of our CDs have been transferred/updated with the appropriate officers now on the signature cards for accounts involving the quilt guild. Several members then had check requests to make of her.

Joanne reported that 166 pillows were finished, 20 just need to be closed, 7 quilts are ready to quilt, and she found 8 quilt kits with pre-cut fabric in them, ready to hand out. She then explained her system for keeping track of all the charity items. Also, Joanne had a donation of two older sewing cabinets, one with a sewing machine in it. She would like to hold onto them for the time being, getting them all cleaned up and ready for auction night.

Ruth said she would have no problem sending out a flash to the members about the Susan Cranshaw workshop on May 14th. Michele reported that area quilt shops have been re-supplied with the bookmarks telling quilters about our guild.

Carole let us know that she will be at NIOSA the night of our general meeting this month, and would need volunteers to help out with the food. That was taken care of.

Beverly asked for some petty cash to help make change at our meeting when members purchase our fundraising items. She was granted he amount she requested. Bebe said she has been making packets by grouping several small items together for the swap, and should have quite a few by swap night.

Dea said that Jessica Schrank would be coming to the next meeting to talk about the Boerne Fest which will also include an outdoor quilt exhibit (weather permitting). The Fest will be held May 7th from 10-5. Jessica will be allowed about ten minutes to tell us about it.

Under new business, Dea said the volunteers are needed to accept items for the boutique table at the October auction. Carole, Joanne, and Bebe volunteered.

Under old business, Dea let us know that not only was the bank business completed, but that the CD transferal from one bank to another was taken care of with no loss of interest or penalty fees incurring. She said she was quite pleased with the professionalism of the bank staff she dealt with.

Dea took down a list of names of those who need to speak to the general membership next Thursday evening. This meeting was adjourned at 7PM.

A $2-6\frac{1}{2}$ SQUARES LIGHT 4-3 1/2" SQUARES


BLUE C 4-3 1/2" SQUARES
