# ABC QUILTING

What a great meeting we had last month! The room was packed with members old and new, just in time to kick off a block-of-the-month program. This is just one of the special activities we're planning throughout the year.

Our January speaker was Lisa Erlandson, whose entertaining and educational program sparked a lot of audience participation. She used vintage quilts to illustrate "the good, the bad, and the ugly" in quilt design. To be honest, I liked some of the ugly quilts best! They make me wonder about the people who made them—who they were, what their lives were like, whether this was a first quilt or a last quilt.

Coincidentally, the very next day someone gave me an old issue of *Quilter's Newsletter*, in which a quilter named Deborah Clark described her most memorable quilt. She had put it together from old blocks she found in a box in her mother's attic—mismatched blocks that someone had pieced from scraps of worn-out clothing. Deborah used black cotton for the sashing and backing. She tied the quilt with purple embroidery floss and bound it with fabric cut from an old purple skirt. Then she stuck the ugly, uncoordinated quilt in the back of the closet.

But then her daughter caught a cold, and the ugly quilt came out of the closet to cover the child as she lay on the couch. A few days later, another child caught the cold and wanted the quilt. Then Deborah herself used it as a lap quilt while she was sewing, and then her husband wanted it as an extra cover at night.

One thing led to another, and the ugly quilt never went back into the closet. Deborah concluded: "So my most memorable quilt is not my best or worst, not the newest or oldest, not the prettiest or the one that won a prize. It's the one my family has loved the hardest."

As we move into February, the month when we celebrate love, isn't that a nice sentiment?

#### **AUCTION NEWS**

The new year brings resolutions to get organized and clean-out our "stuff". When you have sewing and quilting related items that you want to get rid of, please remember that your guild auction can use them. We can use them in the auction or place them on the sale table - depending on their value. Patterns, books, fabric, unfinished projects, laces, rulers – you name it and we'll take it! The auction is in September so hold onto it until May, when Linda Sides will start taking auctions items. Your help in making our auction a success is much appreciated!

<u>Orphan blocks</u> are leftover blocks that you do not use in a project. Perhaps the colors are not what you expected, you made too many blocks, or you started on a project and decided not to finish it. For whatever reason, you have blocks that need a home. If you donate these blocks to our guild "Orphanage", they will be put with other similar blocks to make charity quilts, auction quilts, or sold at the sale table at the auction. Please do not throw them away! Linda Sides is the keeper of these blocks, so if you have any, please give them to her for a guild project! <u>Five-Inch Blocks & Fabric Scraps</u>: The last auction was so successful with a "tower" of 5-inch blocks. We are getting an early start on building another tower! As you cut fabric for a project, keep our tower in mind and cut some 5-inch squares from your leftovers. Or, just set aside 30 minutes to cut some squares from your stash for the tower. Please --- quilt shop quality fabric only.

The 2007 auction had a HUGE bag of fabric scraps that we would like to repeat this year. Save your 2-inch or larger scrap pieces in a bag – taping or hanging a plastic bag near your cutting area will make it easy to remember to save these! You will be surprised how much you collect!

Flight of Fancy – this beautiful appliquéd and pieced quilt has pink roses on a black background and appliqués of flowers, fruit and black birds and runs for 12 months.

Itty Bitty Flakes – Each month, for 12 months, you make three coordinating little quilts with fusible appliqué, embroidered details, and fun button embellishments, each measuring 3½" x 7½".

<u>Moda Mystery Quilt</u> – This quilt, also running 12 months, is appliquéd and pieced in purples, yellows, blues and greens. Some of the blocks will have baskets of flowers. The rest is a mystery that gets revealed over the year.

<u>Garden Friends and Kindred Spirits</u> – These two BOMs both use the sunflower line from EE Schenck, Full Sun. Garden Friends has pieced and appliquéd birdhouses, birds, honeybees and flowers. Kindred Spirits has pieced blocks surrounding a large center block. Both BOMs run 6 months.
