



JULY BOARD MEETING

The July meeting of the Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild board was called to order by President Carole Van Buren at 6pm on Monday, July 2, 2012. There was no report from Vice-President Vickie DuBose. Second Vice-President Jackie Ledford said that all the arrangements are in place for next week's guest speaker, Carol Downey. Jackie showed a densely decorated Christmas ball, about 6 inches in diameter, that Susan Hall would like to provide directions for at our August meeting, if any guild members are interested in taking part. Jackie said she would show the completed Christmas ball at our general meeting this month to gauge interest in doing the project next month. Jackie said she had been contacted by an area guild to see if we were interested in sharing costs for a program and a workshop by Pat Sloan. Even sharing with two other guilds, our costs would be quite prohibitive, almost \$2000, and the board decided not to participate.

Susan made a suggestion about a program next year that wouldn't be nearly so expensive, as the lady lives right here in Texas, and the board tasked Susan with making contact with her. Jackie also reminded us about the needlecase exchange at our Christmas meeting, and said she would remind everybody at next week's general meeting as well.

Joanne had no report to make this evening. There followed some general discussion on putting together orphan blocks into quilts for future use, either at auction or as a donation to a worthy cause, along with any other quilts we have in reserve.

Susan suggested she contact Dea about showing her three retreat quilts with animal themes to the general meeting attendees next week, so they can see how nicely the blocks make up into quilts.




