

2014 RULES FOR THE \$275.00 CHARITY QUILT CHALLENGE

1. Quilts must be a minimum of 45 x 45 or larger.
2. No cheater quilts allowed (printed quilt on one piece of fabric). You MUST piece a quilt. Quilt can be any pattern or theme you like that is child appropriate.
3. You must supply ALL materials (fabric, batting, thread, etc).
4. Must be 100% completed for you to receive a punch (i.e. pieced, quilted and bound).
5. Each completed quilt will be given one punch, which will be initialed by an officer when the quilt is turned in. One card per participant.
6. Your punched card will be held by Charity Chair.
7. EIGHT (8) quilts must be turned in by the November 13th meeting. Only cards with all 8 punches are eligible. Only one prize!
8. You can turn in one quilt each month or all eight in November, or turn them in as you finish. No quilts will be accepted after the November meeting.
9. Only cards that have all eight punches will be placed in a basket (or something similar) for drawing.

Fran's extensive trunk show, “**Using COLOR and Fabric Play**” was awesome! We will never look at fabric the same after seeing how it was used in all of Fran's quilts. Fran shared a story and poem with us that her husband Chuck had written after he learned there was no such thing as an ugly quilt. Of course we had the opportunity to see the quilt too – and could not believe Chuck initially thought it was ugly! We were also all in awe of a quilt Fran created for her church auction and I am sure it will garner lots of donations in support of the youths' mission trip. What a fun evening we had with Fran, her husband Chuck and grandson, Charlie. Our workshop, “Stringing the Stars” quilt on Saturday was spectacular too with lots of beautiful blocks being created, lots of laughter and lots of fun. I think we all enjoyed this workshop and I cannot wait to see everyone's finished blocks as there were many beautiful blocks being created.

Last month during our Guild meeting we saw everyone's fourth row in our row quilt – this project is really coming along! Our very own Guild members Denice Brockmeyer, Beth Barron and Janet Rutherford (a.k.a. “Tres Amigas”) encouraged all of us as they showed us their row for the next month. Beth walked us thru the steps to assemble our next block. Her explanation and demo really helped us all realize we too can do it! It is always great fun to see all of the different color variations our Guild members have used. I am anxious to get my fifth row done now and on to the next row.

Please plan to join us for our program and workshop this month. Angela McCorkle from Priddy, Texas will be our guest. Did you have a chance to see the wall hanging and the quilt she sent? Angela will do a trunk show and demo for us during our Guild meeting on the 12th of June. She is well known for her 10 Minute Blocks and shared with me these are such fun blocks/quilts and are super-fast and easy. She warned me that once we get started making them, we will just want to keep on going! It is not too late to sign up for our workshop (\$35.00) on the 14th of June when we will be making the quilt using the 10 minute rail fence block. For the workshop you only need one jelly roll and 5/8 yd of fabric for the block centers to get started for a throw size quilt. I just love how the quilt looks and I am looking forward to learning how to make this block. You know I might be able to get some of those charity challenge quilts made yet and that wall hanging looks like it would make a quick but beautiful gift for someone special!

It is not too early to plan to attend our July program and workshop either. Cheri Leffler will be our guest. She is right here in San Antonio and has just published a book on Needle-Turn Applique. She will have a presentation and demonstration during our Guild meeting and then we will learn to make a beautiful Needle-Turn Dragonfly Table runner during the workshop on the 12th of July. You can sign up for the workshop at our meeting this month.

We hope you are able to join us on the 12th of June – we look forward to seeing you at the meeting.






UFO Program

RULES:

Participation requires you provide a list of 6 UFOs to Marie Emerson ALONG with 3 fat quarters at the January meeting.

(If 15 people sign up, the starting prize will be 45 fat quarters!).

Beginning at the January, general meeting and then again in March, May, July, September, and November, Marie (or another designee) will draw a number from 1-6. For example, if number 3 is drawn, everyone will work on their number 3 UFO for 2 months.



