
## *KEEPING YOU IN STITCHES.....*

### **2014 RULES FOR THE \$275.00 CHARITY QUILT CHALLENGE**

1. Quilts must be a minimum of 45 x 45 or larger.
2. No cheater quilts allowed (printed quilt on one piece of fabric). You MUST piece a quilt. Quilt can be any pattern or theme you like that is child appropriate.
3. You must supply ALL materials (fabric, batting, thread, etc).
4. Must be 100% completed for you to receive a punch (i.e. pieced, quilted and bound).
5. Each completed quilt will be given one punch, which will be initialed by an officer a the quilt is turned in. One card per participant.
6. Your punched card will be held by Charity Chair.
7. EIGHT (8) quilts must be turned in by the Novemer 13th meeting. Only cards with all 8 punches are eligible. Only one prize!
8. You can turn in one quilt each month or all eight in November, or turn them in as you finish. No quilts will be accepted after the November meeting.
9. Only cards that have all eight punches will be placed in a basket (or something similar) for drawing.

I am anxious to get my fourth row done now and on to the next row.

Plan to join us for our program and workshop this month. Fran Snay from Burleson, Texas will be our guest. On the 8<sup>th</sup> of May during our Guild meeting Fran's program “Using COLOR and Fabric Play” will be her show and tell with lots of beautiful quilts. Her extensive trunk show is a show of colors and fabrics using the old simple traditional patterns. Fran also promises to be fun and humorous. I am sure we will all enjoy seeing her trunk show and learning more about using color in our quilts.


We hope you are able to join us on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May – we look forward to seeing you at the meeting.




## UFO Program

### RULES:

Participation requires you provide a list of 6 UFOs to Marie Emerson ALONG with 3 fat quarters at the January meeting.

(If 15 people sign up, the starting prize will be 45 fat quarters!).

Beginning at the January, general meeting and then again in March, May, July, September, and November, Marie (or another designee) will draw a number from 1-6. For example, if number 3 is drawn, everyone will work on their number 3 UFO for 2 months.

At the next UFO meeting show your completed UFO to get credit. If you have NOT finished the designated UFO you MUST pay a fat quarter as a fine. However, at the end of the year, you will still be eligible to have your name entered in the drawing if you have all 6 UFOs completed and any necessary fines paid. The winner(s) receive ALL the fat quarters


