PROGRAMS

Hello Everyone! If you were not able to join us for Margie Lawrence's Round Robin program in January you really missed a fun evening. Margie, from "RR Retreats by Margie" in La Grange, TX, shared several lovely quilts with us that were made as part of round robin challenges and provided a wealth of tips and pointers from her many years of organizing and participating in round robins. Her thought provoking suggestions and personalized journals for each of her quilts has us rethinking our plans to launch our own round robin challenge. I think the tweaks we will make because of them will make our challenge more enjoyable for everyone. So start thinking about your round robin challenge and what panel or center block you would like to have your team build on to create your unique quilt. Consider what the finished project will be used for: table topper, wall hanging, or quilt and what size would you like it to be? Will your quilt have a seasonal theme or color scheme? Will you provide all of the fabrics to be used or can team members use their own high quality quilt fabric? Will all of the fabric used be pre-washed or not? As I mentioned at our January meeting you can sign up with four of your quilting buddies to form a group or you can just sign up and be assigned to a group. Based on Margie's suggestions we will let the individual groups establish their own timelines for when the round is due and where they will meet to exchange the round robin. I will start taking signups at our next meeting. It sounded like Margie had a lot of fun with her round robins and I think we can have a lot of fun with ours too!

You will not want to miss this month's program on Thursday, February 11th at 7:00 p.m. as we are finally able to have one of our "snow birds," the very talented Joan Wallace, do a mini trunk show and presentation entitled "Every Quilter is an Artist." In addition to showing us some of her lovely quilts Joan will share her philosophy and how to make your quilts "Art Quilts." I can hardly wait until the meeting to see what Joan has in store for us since all of the items she has previously shared with us during "Show and Tell" were absolutely beautiful and so very creative. Are you ready to be inspired?

And then in March, mark your calendars and plan to join us as Karen Lambdin will be presenting her Portrait Quilt program and workshop. I have Karen's sample portrait quilt so you can see the techniques she will teach us during the workshop (Saturday, the 12th of March). It is not too late to sign up for the workshop and select the photo you want to use. You will need to email your photo to Karen by the 1st week in March so she can have time to get it prepared prior to the workshop.

It is also not too early to sign up for Cathy Kropp's Paper Piecing Workshop, "A Wreath for All Seasons" to be held on May 14th.

At our meeting last month Dea Heller and Janet Daniel showed us two examples of table runners they had made for Valentine's Day and shared some pointers with us on how we could create our own. This year, in addition to our round robin challenge, Dea and Janet will share some other seasonal table toppers or table runners which might interest you. We would love to see your interpretation of your Valentine table topper or runner at our February meeting. I wonder what theme Dea and Janet will share with us next time as we work thru the holidays on the calendar.

And be sure to check out our Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild 2016 calendar to see what else we have planned for this year. I hope you are able to join us for some of those events. Also please send me any suggestions for next year's programs and workshops since often speaker's calendars are booked well in advance. I could not pull this all together without your support and suggestions – please keep them coming!

TABLE RUNNER PROGRAM Charm Pack Table Runner

(Provided at January General Meeting)

1 Charm Pack

3 Strips of fabric cut 1 inch wide

strips of fabric cut 3 h inches wide

1/3 yard of fabric for back

pieces of fabric cut 2 1/4 inches wide for binding

Select 24 of the charm pack for your center of your table runner. Sew them together in rows of 3.

Then you place Wonder Under on the back of each square you are going to cut for hearts. I used another 6 of the charm pack for hearts. After you have the hearts sewn on you will take the strip of fabric you cut 1 inch wide, you will place it on the ironing board and press it in half length wise. You may baste it on the top and pin in place from edge to edge. You will cut them to fit the top. Then you may take the strips of fabric for the border, you may place them on the edge starting with the long side first, then sew on the ends. When finished you have a Table Runner
