I felt very lucky as I scored two tickets to the Houston Quilt Show in addition to some flannel that will be just the thing to use in a Christmas quilt I want to make. We also had a great workshop last month with Marcia Henry teaching the "Metro Rings" quilt using the Quick Curve Ruler. I cannot wait to see everyone's quilt tops as there were some beautiful rings being created using this amazing ruler.

We have another inspiring evening lined up for our program on Thursday, November 10th as **Cynthia Le-Blanc Regone**, from Cajun Classic Quilts in Katy, Texas will be our guest speaker. She will be doing a presentation and trunk show for us. Cynthia is quilt designer, lecturer, instructor, and author. She started quilting in 1981 and within ten years was producing award-winning quilts. Cynthia lectures and teaches throughout the United States. She has served on the board of several state and local guilds in Oklahoma and Texas. She was a featured teacher at the 31st Annual National Quilting Association Show in 2000 and teaches at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas. Several of her designs have been featured in Fons and Porters magazine *Love of Quilting, Quilt Works Today*, and *Quilting Today* magazines. In April 2007, That Patchwork Place published her first quilting book "Colorful Quilts - A Journey Through Fabric". True to her roots, Cynthia designs under her own quilt pattern label named, Cajun Classics.

And then on Saturday, November 12th, Cynthia will be conducting a workshop for us. We will be making the Homespun Hearts and Baskets quilt. It is not too late to sign up for this workshop. Just for this month, the workshop will be held at St. Matthews United Methodist Church (the same location as our Guild meeting) from 9:00 a.m. to 3 p.m. Check out Cynthia's website: <a href="http://cajunclassicquilts.com">http://cajunclassicquilts.com</a> for a picture of this quilt. I will also have her quilt sample to show you at the meeting! **ACCOMODATIONS:** Our accommodations are 2 bedroom condos; with 4 people to a condo. 1 bedroom has 2 queen beds and the other bedroom has 2 twin beds. Parking is close to each condo, and most things are handicap accessible. They have a lovely pool and tennis courts if you want to relax and play. If you have specific needs please let me know at time of sign up, also any special dietary requirements.
