

ALAMO HERITAGE QUILT GUILD JANUARY 2017

PROGRAMS

Hello Everyone! At our December Guild meeting we had an awesome Christmas party. What a turnout to celebrate our love of all things quilting, great friendships and the end of another spectacular year! If you were not able to join us I hope you have had a chance to check out our website and get a peek at the beautiful quilt that was presented to our outgoing Guild president, Janet Daniel. In addition, check out the pictures of some of the mug rugs that were part of the mug rug exchange. The table holding all of the "wrapped" mug rugs for exchange was indeed a unique array of food products and other household goods boxes instead of the traditional Christmas gift wrap. It made for a very interesting display and many very unique and creative mug rugs were unveiled when members opened the boxes they had chosen. We had our own "Pinterest" thing going and I now have lots of great ideas to choose from for the next time I participate in a mug rug exchange!

I am excited about our calendar for 2017 as we have some very talented artists (a.k.a. quilters) in our lineup and a variety of programs that will be sure to grab your interest. Denise Green from "Holly Dee Quilts" in Luling Texas, will be our first guest on January12th. Denise will be doing a trunk show and share some beautiful quilts with us. She began her quilting journey in 1995. Denise now travels cross-country lecturing and teaching as a Judy Niemeyer Certified Instructor. She will be sharing tips, tricks, techniques, and above all, her love of quilting. Denise will also be teaching the "The Cactus Flower", a Judy Niemeyer's foundation paper pieced table runner, table topper or quilt. The same cactus flower is used in all three projects so you can choose to do any one of the three and will want to purchase the pattern for the one you plan to make. I am still taking signups for the workshop and have the patterns available to purchase for your project.

You will not want to miss February either as we will have a very special program. Peggy True, a well-known quilter from right here in San Antonio, will be presenting a program entitled "Fascinations – a Quilter's Exploration of Designing with Radial Symmetry" with a trunk show of 45 quilts. In addition, Peggy will share with us information on the "Threads of Love" charity which she has been involved with here in San Antonio for more than 11 years. Peggy will have a display of items made for this charity/ministry which distributes clothing and care items to the premature babies (living and deceased) serviced by local San Antonio hospitals, crisis pregnancy care centers and Any Baby Can. For our February Guild meeting, our members are encouraged to bring donations of 1 yard of cotton or flannel baby print fabric or a skein of non-allergenic baby yard to donate to "Threads of Love" charity. On the calendar for the February workshop slot you will notice a designated "Auction Sew In". This year we will have our big fund raiser with our Auction in October. For those members who are new to the Guild I should explain the auction is held every other year so it is on the schedule for Saturday, October 14th, 2017. The auction helps pay for our Guild's guest speakers, programs, and workshops. We have a professional auctioneer and lots of quilts, a silent auction and boutique items for sale. An event of this magnitude takes lots of preparation and volunteers. In order to prepare for this big event, we have scheduled some designated "Auction Sew Ins" dates on the calendar this year such as we have for February 11th. More details and planning will be shared in the near future as we will be asking for volunteers to help so that we can once again have a very successful event and with many hands making light work (and an enjoyable event) for all.

In March, Michael Young, one of our very own Guild members, will be presenting a trunk show for us. You may recall seeing a few of Michael's beautiful quilts during "Show and Tell" at previous Guild meetings. I can hardly wait until March to see what Michael has in store for us. In addition, he will be teaching a "One Block Wonder" quilt at our March 11th workshop. I am taking signups for Michael's workshop now too and this is one workshop you will not want to miss.

Nor is it too early to plan to attend Trish Stuart's workshop on May 13th. Trish, from "Trish Stuart Designs" in Emory, Texas, will be doing a trunk show and talk on color theory for our program on May 11th and then on Saturday she will teach us how to create our own happy garden of funky wool flowers in this contemporary wool wall hanging. The background will be a hand-painted batik. We will learn the ins and outs of successfully machine stitching wool to a batik foundation. Trish is offering to have kits available for the workshop if there is enough interest in purchasing a kit. I will need to know if you are taking the workshop and will be purchasing a kit or providing your own fabrics by the beginning of April so Trish has time to prepare the kits for our workshop. Since this requires advanced planning, I will also be taking signups for this May workshop starting in January.

Check out our Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild 2017 calendar to see what else we have planned for this year. I hope you are able to join us for some of those events. Also, please send me any suggestions for next year's programs and workshops since often speaker's calendars are booked well in advance. I could not pull this all together without your support and suggestions – please keep them coming!

We hope you are able to join us at the Guild meeting on January 12th, you won't want to miss it, and we look forward to seeing you there.


