PROGRAMS

Hello Everyone! Wow! I believe we had a great start to our programs and workshops for 2017! I hope you were able to join us this past month when Denise Green from "Holly Dee Quilts" in Luling was our guest speaker. Denise shared tips, tricks, techniques, and above all, her love of quilting and had many quilts and quilt tops to show us which she had made as a certified Judy Niemeyer instructor. Denise also taught a workshop the following Saturday where the attendees had a chance to begin piecing their own "Cactus Flower", a Judy Niemeyer's foundation paper pieced table runner or table topper. I look forward to seeing everyone finished table runner or topper at one of the upcoming Guild meetings as I think they are going to be beautiful!

You will not want to miss this month's Guild meeting either as we will have a very special program. Our guest speaker will be Peggy True, whose quilts and wearable art pieces have been exhibited regionally and nationally, earning numerous awards including First Place, Best of Show, and Viewers' Choice in prestigious judged venues. She will be presenting a program entitled "Fascinations – a Quilter's Exploration of Designing with Radial Symmetry" with a trunk show of 45 quilts. In addition, Peggy will share information on the "Threads of Love" charity which she has been involved with here in San Antonio for many years. Peggy will have a display of items made for this charity/ministry which distributes clothing and care items to the premature babies (living and deceased) serviced by local San Antonio hospitals, crisis pregnancy care centers and Any Baby Can. For our February Guild meeting, our members are encouraged to bring donations of 1 yard of cotton or flannel baby print fabric or a skein of non-allergenic baby yard to donate to "Threads of Love" charity. On the calendar for the February workshop slot you will notice a designated "Auction Sew In". This year we will have our big fund raiser with our Auction in October. For those members who are new to the Guild I should explain the auction is held every other year so it is on the schedule for Saturday, October 14th, 2017. The auction helps pay for our Guild's guest speakers, programs, and workshops. We have a professional auctioneer and lots of quilts, a silent auction and boutique items for sale. An event of this magnitude takes lots of preparation and volunteers. In order to prepare for this big event, we have scheduled some designated "Auction Sew Ins" dates on the calendar this year such as we have for February 11th. Janet Daniel, our 2017 Auction Chair, will share additional information with us on how we can all get involved and help, not only during the designated "Auction Sew Ins" but throughout the year in preparation for the Auction in October. I would like to thank you in advance for helping so that we can once again have a very successful event and with many hands making light work (and an enjoyable event) for all.

At our Guild meeting in March, Michael Young, one of our very own Guild members, will be presenting a trunk show for us. You may recall seeing a few of Michael's beautiful quilts during "Show and Tell" at previous Guild meetings. I can hardly wait until March to see what Michael has in store for us. In addition, he will be teaching a "One Block Wonder" quilt at our March 11th workshop. At our January Guild meeting Michael shared his sample with us and talked about our fabric selection for the one block wonder. You will need 6 repeats of a fabric that has a 15 to 24 inch repeat of design. Yardage will vary depending on the length of the repeat. He cautioned us to ensure when our yardage was being cut that we do not miscount the actual number of repeats. Michael also stated DO NOT wash the fabric before class as to do so will distort the way the fabric layers line up. I am taking signups for Michael's workshop now and this is one workshop you will not want to miss.

Nor is it too early to plan to attend Trish Stuart's workshop on May 13th. Trish, from "Trish Stuart Designs" in Emory, Texas, will be doing a trunk show and talk on color theory for our program on May 11th and then on Saturday she will teach us how to create our own happy garden of funky wool flowers in this contemporary wool wall hanging. The background will be a hand-painted batik. We will learn the ins and outs of successfully machine stitching wool to a batik foundation. In addition, we will explore how to further embellish our wall hanging. Trish is offering to have kits available for the workshop if there is enough interest in purchasing a kit. I will need to know if you are taking the workshop and will be purchasing a kit or providing your own fabrics by the beginning of April so Trish has time to prepare the kits for our workshop. Since this requires advanced planning, I am also now taking signups for this May workshop. In March I will have Trish's sample wall hanging to share with you.

Check out our Alamo Heritage Quilt Guild 2017 calendar to see what else we have planned for this year. I hope you are able to join us for some of those events. Also, please send me any suggestions for next year's programs and workshops since often speaker's calendars are booked well in advance. I could not pull this all together without your support and suggestions – please keep them coming!

We hope you are able to join us at the Guild meeting on February 9th, you won't want to miss it, and we look forward to seeing you there.

Tribute to Dea Heller

Dea Heller was born in Gary, Indiana. She was not German as many of us thought, she was Cherokee. She had a very colorful and full life.

Dea moved to New York at the age of 17, married Ron and the journey began. They had four daughters (which must have been fun for Ron). Due to Ron's job they moved quite often. Their family lived in Maryland, Virginia, California (both southern and northern), Colorado and then on to Texas.

She had five foster children in California (four girls were not enough). Dea had various jobs in various states, (seamstress, ice cream shop owner, dress shop owner, realtor, and then my favorite---quilt teacher). She was a long time active member of Holy Trinity Presbyterian Church. Dea started and participated in more than one bee, and was one of the original members of our guild. She made and quilted some beautiful quilts, some of which won ribbons. Many of the quilts she quilted for others also won ribbons.

Dea started quilting classes in her home, where she not only taught, but helped new and experienced quilters. I was fortunate enough to be one of her long-time students (10 years).

I think everyone who took classes from her will agree we all ripped many seams. If you asked her opinion about if you should rip a seam she would say, "Well if you can live with it...." Of course, after that statement we ripped.

Dea was also involved in organizing two annual retreats, one for her students and one for members and friends of the guild. As with her classes, you could always go up to her "spot" and ask for help and she gave it.

Dea Heller will be missed greatly as a teacher, friend and fellow quilter.
