Bylaws, Standing Rules
Sew 'n Sew's

Changes/additions/deletions:

ARTICLE II ~~Object~~ to ARTICLE II Mission

ARTICLE IV Officers, Section 5. Duties of Officers. , A. The President shall:

12. shall receive the monthly bank statements ~~which contain copies of and~~ cancelled checks from the Treasurer to review, verify and initial within 30(thirty) days,

ARTICLE VI Meetings

Section 1. Business Meetings. The business meetings, held to further the ~~object of AHQG~~ AHQG Mission and act upon any business matters that may be brought before the membership,

Section 3. Special Meeting. All members shall receive notice of any special meetings, socials, gatherings, etc. that are directed by the Board. Notice constitutes the publication in the monthly newsletter, phone call, fax, e-mail, ~~AHQG Flash~~, voice mail, etc.

ARTICLE VII Board of Directors, Section 2. Duties and Powers.

- D. approve expenditures up to ~~\$200.00~~ \$500.00 (~~two~~ five hundred dollars) not in the budget;
- E. present to the membership for approval, all expenditures that are not in the approved budget that exceed ~~\$200.00~~ \$500.00 (~~two~~ five hundred dollars);
- K. Signatory officers shall be President, 1st Vice President and Treasurer.

ARTICLE VIII Committees, Section 3. Duties of the Standing Committees.

B. The Fundraising Committee shall:

- 1. initiate, ~~but not limited to raffle quilts and~~ all fund raising efforts;

C. The General Meeting Enterprises Committee shall have the following subcommittee:

~~Newsletter Raffle, Fat Chance, Block of the Month, and Trading Post.~~ The General Meetings Enterprises Committee chair shall appoint a chair for each subcommittee.

~~1. Newsletter Raffle Subcommittee shall:~~

~~a. maintain a table and supervise drawings; and~~

~~b. provide the Treasurer with any monies collected.~~

~~3. Block of the Month Subcommittee shall choose a pattern or a special project each month and submit information to the newsletter editor.~~

~~4. Trading Post Subcommittee shall offer the opportunity for AHQG members to sell or swap items.~~

E. The Membership Committee shall consist of the following subcommittees: Hospitality, Sunshine and Shadows, Quilt Angels/Greeters, and Beekeeper ~~and Secret Friends.~~

~~6. The Secret Friends Subcommittee shall maintain a list of and reassign participants if necessary; and handle any problems that may arise.~~

RECEIPT/DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS:

1. For all incoming funds of \$5.00 (five dollars) or over, a three-part written carbon receipt shall be prepared. The original copy shall be given to the payee, one copy to the treasurer and one copy to the committee chair who is collecting the money. There will be ~~two-one~~ exemptions, ~~raffle tickets and~~ any Fund Raiser event.

She will give us a close up look at her quilting techniques and artistic selections. We are so fortunate to fit her into our schedule before her Millefiori Quilt goes to the Texas Quilt Museum to be part of an exhibit Oct 4th – Dec 23rd.

August is our Annual Potluck Salad Supper when we will also discuss preparation for our 2 Fabric Bargello Quilt Workshop. Tony Hansen with Circle H Mobile Sharpening will be setting up in the parking lot by 6 pm so be sure to bring knives, scissors and your finest silver toothpicks!!

In September, we have **Dianne Loper, Handquilter Educator, and Patty and Thomas Woods from Patty's Sewing** here to talk about the exciting new ideas with your own mid-longarm machine. They will be bringing a 5 ft HQ and setting it up so you can get up close and personal.

We also have a great Workshop planned for Sept! **Cathy Kropp will be teaching the 2-Fabric Bargello Quilt**. We have started taking signups for the workshop. Please see me or a handy assistant to get signed up at our June meeting. Also, those who signed up last month will be able to pay and pick up the class planning sheet. We have 9 signups so far and I have interest from non-Guild members. So grab your seat! Please be thinking about our upcoming 2019 Programs. First, we have the Barn Quilt Lady, Suzi Parron, coming in January. She will also have a workshop where you can paint your own Barn Quilt block for your Favorite location!

In March, Charlotte Angiotti will be our guest to talk about surprising ourselves with great ideas for using up our stash! She will also be offering a Mystery Quilt workshop on Saturday, March 16, 2019. We will need commitments from those who plan to participate in the "Let Me Surprise You" Mystery Quilt workshop which requires that attendees purchase the completely precut kit that they receive at the start of the workshop along with the first clue! We have started an interest list to help with venue planning. Kit reservations will be due in Sept when we must commit our numbers needed to Charlotte Angiotti. So far, we have 16 people signed up. Twelve of those have indicated they would be interested in doing the Mystery quilt workshop at a retreat. There is still plenty of room for you and a group of friends!

DR. MARIAN ANN J. MONTGOMERY

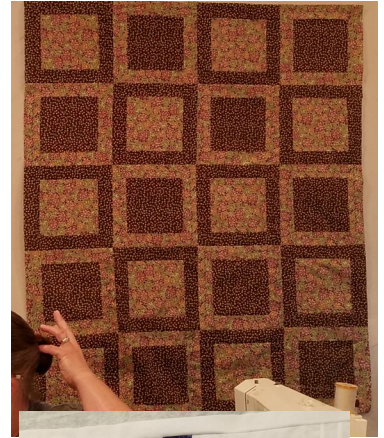
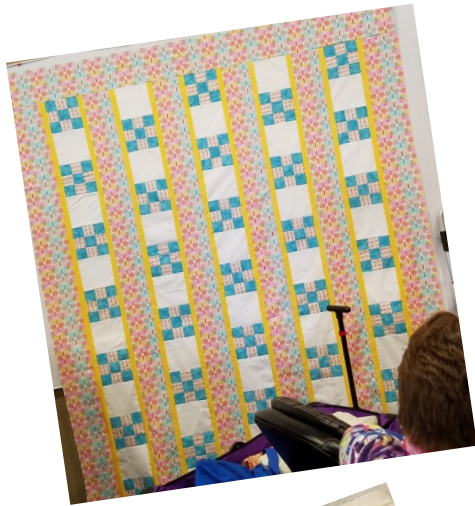
Dr. Marian Ann J. Montgomery, Curator of Clothing and Textiles at the Museum of Texas Tech University will share images of the highlights of the over 350 quilts at the Museum putting them in the context of American History.

Dr. Montgomery is a quilter and has been a member of the Quilter's Guild of Dallas since the late 1980s when she was working with the quilts at the Dallas Museum of Art. Her Ph.D. in Fashion and Textile History was earned through New York University where her studies were in the collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. She happened to meet a tall Texan in the galleries of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and marriage to him brought her to Texas. Having worked in the museum business for over 30 years, Dr. Montgomery landed her dream job as Curator of Clothing and Textiles at the Museum of Texas Tech University in 2014 where she cares for over 32,000 objects—the largest collection of this sort of material at a university in America. Her 2016, “Legacy of a Thousand Stitches,” led the museum director to admit that quilt exhibits have to be considered blockbusters. Her recent partnership with The Quilt Show is sharing information about the Museum's collection with 100,000 subscribers on the third Wednesday of the month. Marian Ann brings a thorough knowledge of the quilt world from both the historic aspect to the latest trends, as she is both a quilt scholar and quilt maker.

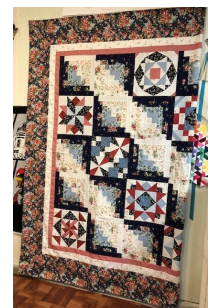
Two kits left in the **Floral Menagerie Block of the Month** that started in Nov. Please talk to me if you would like to try it. Working on Block 7 this month!

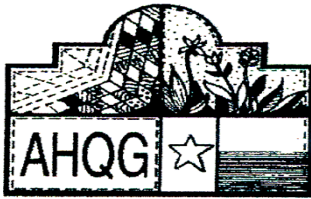
