ACCOMMODATIONS: Our accommodations are 2 bedroom condos with 4 people to a condo. 1 bedroom has 2 queen beds and the other bedroom has 2 twin beds. Parking is close to each condo and most things are handicap accessible. There is a lovely pool and tennis courts if you want to relax and play. If you have specific needs please let me know at the time of sign up, will try to accommodate special dietary requirements.

MEALS: Hearty meals will be served in the dining room starting with dinner at 6:00 the day of your arrival, either Thursday or Friday. Three meals will be served daily, other than Sunday, which will be only breakfast and lunch.

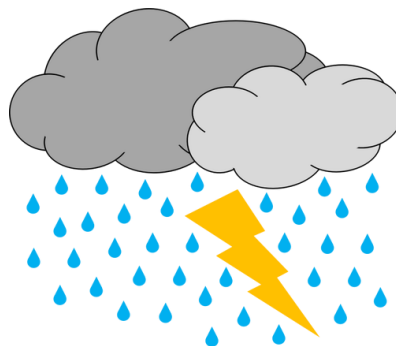

In October, we will have our skill builder night! **Karen Lambdin and Michael Young** will be demonstrating **Feathers and Y seams**. **Lisa Karp** will be showing us how to get a backing out of a smaller than usual piece of fabric by using **diagonal backing seams**. **This will be a fun and active night so be there or be square!**

"Sue Garman: Traditional Masterworks"

The Texas Quilt Museum will feature a retrospective from the late quilting superstar, Sue Garman. "Sue Garman: Traditional Masterworks" which will run June 28-September 30, 2018.

Thanks to the generosity of Garman's family, the Museum has filled two galleries with this master quilter's original creations. Garman was widely known through her internet site ComeQuilt.com which has been continued by her two daughters since her 2017 passing. For four decades, Garman generously shared her techniques, innovative patterns, and advice with thousands of quilt enthusiasts. Her own quilts won numerous prizes and were recognized for their excellence. They've been published in many magazines as well as the book, "500 Traditional Quilts."

Garman was gifted in mathematics, with a CPA degree, and a lifelong career as an executive at NASA. The attention to detail demanded by her job can be seen in her quilts, with precision piecing as well as amazingly detailed appliqué in her inspiring compositions.

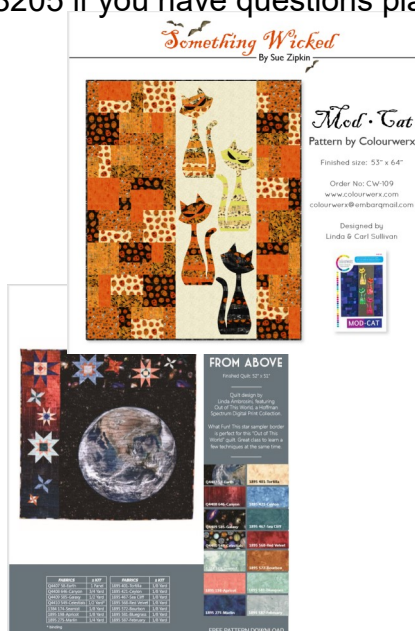
