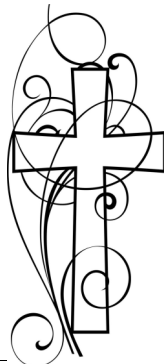

We currently have 93 members who have paid their 2022 dues.

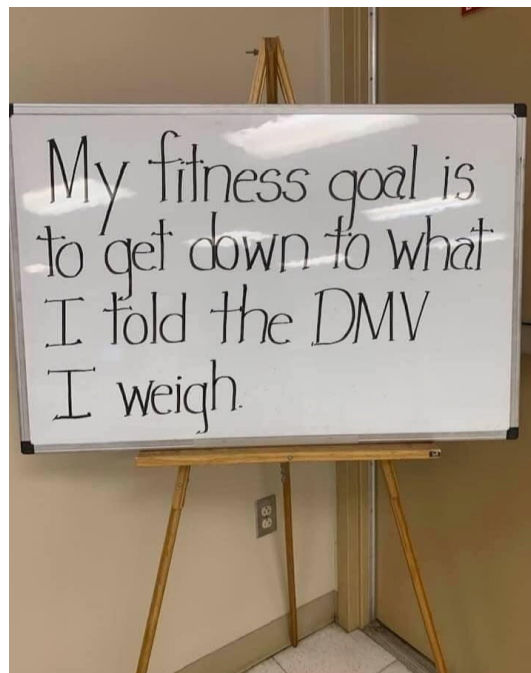

Why Do Quilts Cost So Much?

Cost of materials, construction & finishing for a 65" x 65" Throw Quilt

Materials for the Throw Quilt

Fabric for quilt top

Regular Quilt Shop Price

6 yds @ \$14.00 yd = \$84
5 yards Backing @ \$14.00 yd = \$70
72" x 90" 80/20 Batting = \$19.99
5/8 yd Binding @ \$14.00 yd = \$8.75
Pattern @ \$15.00
Thread for Piecing \$9.00

Total cost Regular Price \$206.74

(not including sales tax and mark up)

A handy hint for those who enjoy quilting or stitching by hand -

Thread a whole packet of needles onto your spool of thread- one right after the other, then knot the end.

All of your needles will stay on the spool.

As you need one, pull one needle with the length of thread needed and cut and tie another knot on the thread still attached to the spool.

You will get fewer knots and tangles in your thread and will not have to stop for a while to thread a needle.

Machine applique and color/fabric selection are her expertise. She has been on the "Quilt Show" numerous times and has her own podcast. The Program will be **"Help!! My Fabric Stash Is Growing and I Can Not Make It Stop"**.

The workshop (held at Linda Clark's home) will be on machine applique/blanket stitch (nothing like hand applique). This will be a great introduction to applique. You will be working on a panel which will have gentle curved flowers and dragonflies. The pattern lends itself for your own design. Please be open to new experiences and having fun. (see picture).

The **July 12th meeting** guest is **Candyce Grisham, iCandy Fiber Art**. Candyce has taught quilting for more than 20 years. She has had quilts and fiber art pieces juried into shows with Missouri Fiber Artists, the American Quilter's Society in Kentucky and the International Quilt Association in Houston. Her latest publication is **Reimagined Dresden Quilt Blocks**.

The workshop will be a unique wall hanging using Dresden Quilt Blocks from her book. You will designing your own creativity to design unique artwork.

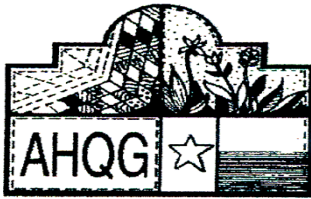
