From Your President

Dear Friends,

Quilters are such an amazing group of people. I sent out the call for the citizens of Uvalde and you came through with flying colors!! Yesterday, Buddy and I drove to Uvalde and delivered 45 beautiful quilts to Diana Bonnet who is the chair of Quilts of Grace. They are not a guild, more like a bee of ladies that get together and put together very simple quilts and give them to CASA who gives them to children who will go into foster care or being adopted. Recipients can also be first responders, hospital staff or patients and now funeral directors. They have no auction, no way to make money. They rely on donations. No one has a long-arm machine. One lady quilts them on her machine by "stitch in the ditch." Diana was overwhelmed by the quilts we brought. She said most of ours would be given to the families that lost children. It was a very emotional day. Buddy and I drove by the school and in the square where they have a memorial. We saw the thousands of flowers, teddy bears and crosses, etc. Joyce Boyd cut a lot of fabric I had into 5" squares. I thought I might sew them into a tablecloth or sell them at our auction. I now know where I am going to send them. If you are doing some reorganizing and have some fabric you want to get rid of, you can bring it to the quilt. I know there are some people who still have a quilt to donate, and I will take that. There is no deadline. This is ongoing. I had told someone that the quilts needed to be new, but I was wrong. If you have a gently used quilt, we can donate that as well. If people want to send a donation, the check can be made to:

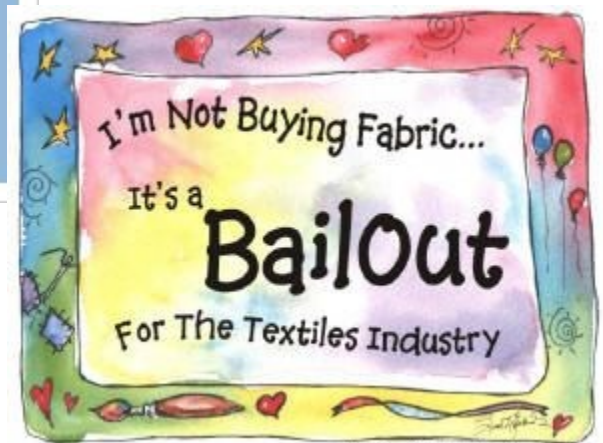
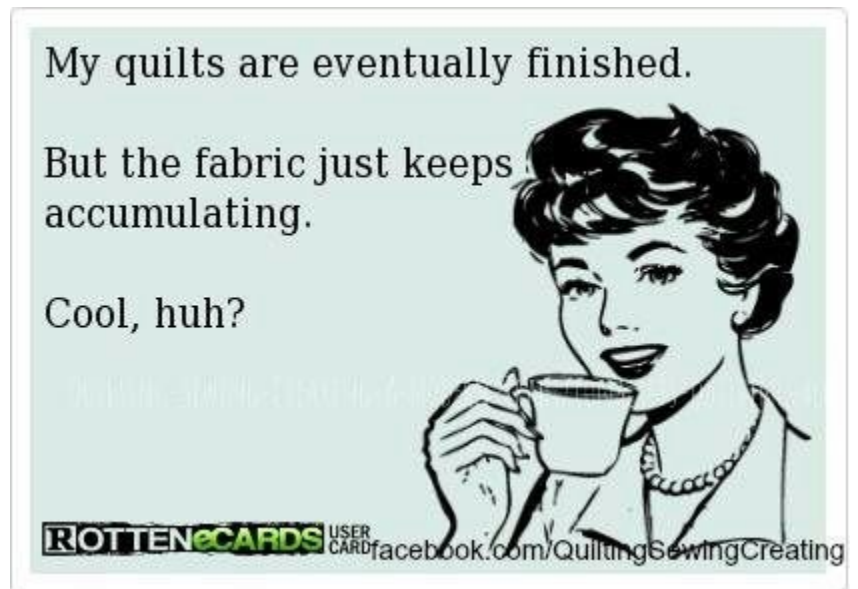

We still have tops in need of quilting. If you have time to help with quilting, please come and see us at the meeting. We have several quilters that have volunteered to complete the binding process.

As you can see, we are accepting quilted quilts, pieced or applique tops and special items (quilted totes, dolls, etc).

Also, at this time we are in desperate need of 2.5" strips in black and white or red, white and blue strips AND 5" squares any color!!

We'll also have a scrap bag auctioned. This is always a popular item among our scrappy quilters! If you have scraps that you just can't seem to organize or just don't want to, consider donating to our SCRAP BAG. Each auction, it seems to get heavier!
