LOOKING AHEAD 2024

Program - January 9th Carrie Wikander (thezenquilter.com) from Fredericksburg will be with us talking about her inspiration behind her quilts, from inspiration to a finished product! Carrie also has been working with ombre fabrics and has kinda been obsessed with them! We can look forward to her trunk show of her own designs and how she has been using ombre fabrics. No Workshop.

Program – March 12th Janet Plentl of Javibe Barn Quilts (Javibebarnquilts.com) Journey into Barn Quilts and the Hill Country Barn Quilt Trail. Janet is an artist and owner of JaVibe Barn Quilts in Marble Falls. Janet's barn quilts have been blue ribbon winners at the Burnet County fair and featured in local newspapers and magazines. To spread the joy of barn quilts, Janet has formed the Hill Country Quilt Trail. This free trail encourages the public viewing and promotion of barn quilts in the Texas hill country.

Workshop – Janet will be teaching the art form of barn quilts in a workshop. She provides ALL the supplies and you will provide your desired block pattern (two weeks prior to the workshop date). For inspiration, look at Janet's facebook or Instagram for previous class designs. Look at Barn Quilt Headquarters website (Janet is the artist for them!). Look at Pinterest for barn quilt ideas. No curves, circles or complicated patterns (you only have 6 hours). More information will be provided once you have registered and paid for the workshop. Cost \$95.00.

You can go home with a finished barn quilt!



Quilters,

How would you like up to three (3) chances to win a crisp \$100 bill to help defray your holiday spending?? Have we got a deal for you.

Joanne Krepps, our Charity Chairperson, is inundated with quilt kits from a local area guild that sadly is disbanding. In addition, she has lots of quilt kits that need to be sewn so they can be donated and out of her house. We don't want a stack of fabric to fall on her!!!!

So, the Board of Directors has come up with a brilliant plan to help reduce this backlog. From now until the December meeting, you will have a chance to win \$100 during the October, November, and December meetings. What do you have to do?

- Pick up a quilt kit.
- Take it home and complete it.
- Return it to next month's meeting.
- Get a ticket for a drawing.

Each month will start over. October's losing tickets will be thrown out and the November drawing will be for completed quilts turned in at the November meeting. Ditto for the December drawing.

Do I have to take a kit or can I just donate a completed charity quilt? No, you don't have to take a kit, although that is preferable. A charity quilt made and quilted from your stash and donated will get you a ticket.

Joanne also has many tops and backings that need quilting. The top comes with batting, backing and binding fabric included. Take one of these and return the completed quilt and you get a ticket.

Do completed pillowcases count in this contest? Unfortunately, not this time. Pillowcases take up less room and aren't a priority right now.

Is these a specific size? No. We will accept any size from lap size, NICU size, twin size, or larger; size is up to you.

What if I take a kit in September, but I don't get it finished by the October meeting? You can still turn it in November and get a ticket. We simply ask that all completed quilts be turned in by the December meeting.




