ACCOMODATIONS: Our accommodations are 2 bedroom condos with 4 people to a condo: 1 bedroom has 2 queen beds and the other bedroom has 2 twin beds. Parking is close to each condo and most things are handicap accessible. There is a lovely pool, and tennis courts if you want to relax and play. If you have specific needs, please let me know at the time of sign up, will try to accommodate special dietary requirements.





When a woman in her sewing room says 5 more minutes... think last 5 minutes of 4th quarter and both teams have all their timeouts!


