Cyndi achieved the distinguished title of National Quilt Association Certified Teacher of the Year, has won awards in the Hoffman Challenge, the Colorado Stat4e Fair, Mancuso Visuals #1 2020, for best Long-arm Workmanship and the Vermont Quilt Festival 2021 for Exceptional Merit. Her quilts have been exhibited at the Houston International Quilt Festival and AQS Paducah among other local and national shows. Cyndi's first book, Fun with Panels, C&T Publishing was released in Fall 2022. Cyndi's passion for quilt making is evident in comments from her students and her never-ending quest to find new techniques and skills to share so that quilting is a fun, enjoyable lifelong endeavor.




